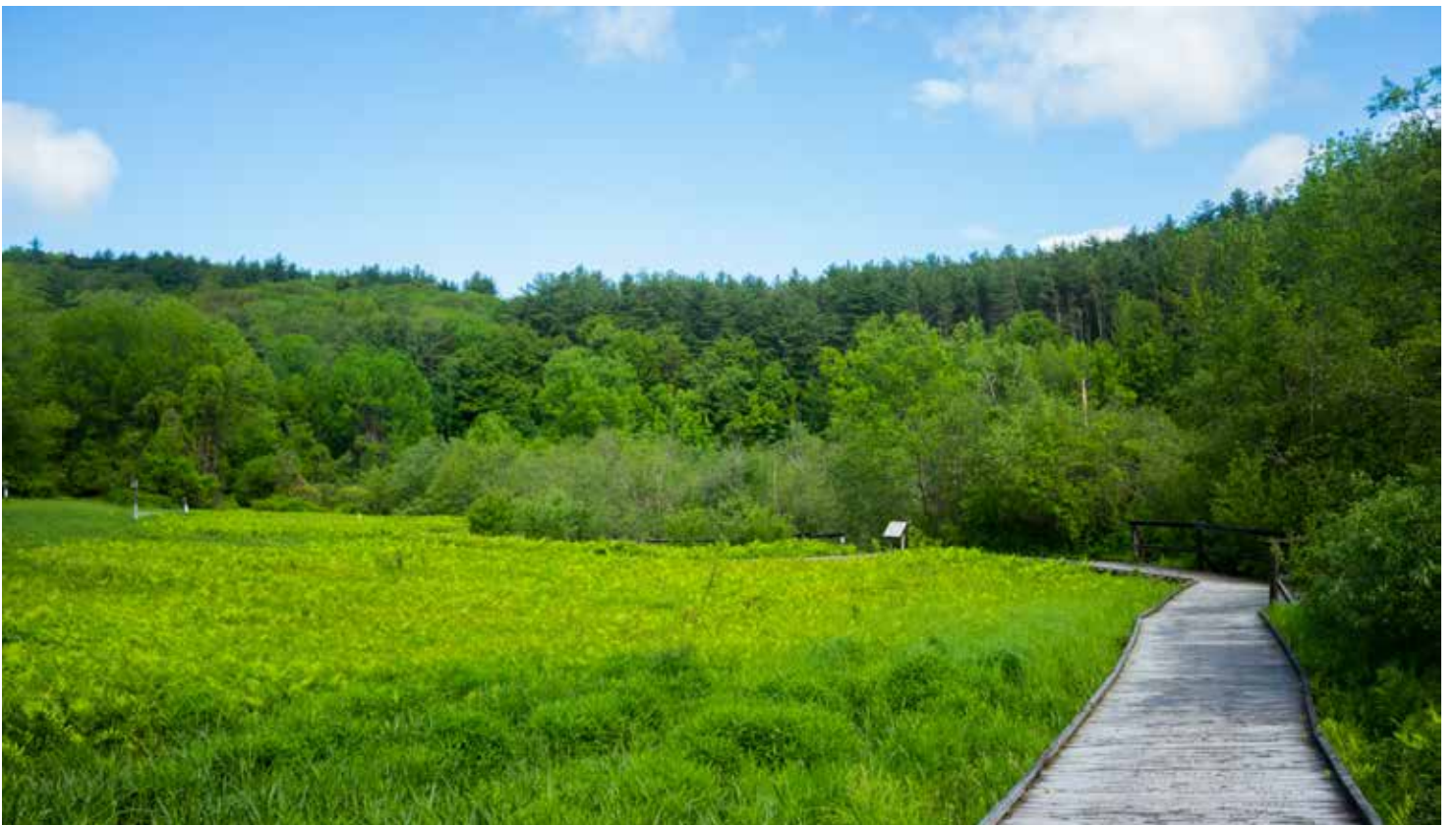

2019 IN REVIEW

The year 2019 was one for the record books. Many will remember it as the Year of the Dinosaur. From July 1 to September 30, five animatronic life-sized Dinosaurs ruled the trail. The public response was amazing making it a blockbuster year at the admissions window with more than 71,000 visitors. The major construction project on site was the completion of the new Early Childhood Education Center – new home of the Blue Heron School. Now ten years old, the school was able to double its capacity in its lovely new space and 39 students were enrolled. The building was designed by architects Sonya Misiaszek and Rob Turpin of Misiaszek Turpin pllc, with construction management by Barry Gaw and Sippican Partners. The Early Childhood Education Center was made possible by contributions to our Education Matters Capital Campaign, which continued throughout the year.

Senior Naturalist Dave Erler celebrated 40 years at the Science Center and received the Legacy Award from the New Hampshire Environmental Educators and a commendation from Governor Chris Sununu for his dedication to nature ecology. Dave taught his last program on November 1 before his retirement. His impact lives on. The Science Center would not be what it is today without Dave’s remarkable contribution. At our Annual Meeting in August, in addition to celebrating Dave, we recognized the 25 years of service of Naturalist Eric D’Aleo, 15 years for Finance Director Brian Eaton, 15 years for Administrative Assistant Mary Noyes, five years for Education Director Audrey Eisenhauer (in her current role), five years for Facilities Assistant Keith Hosking, and five years for Operations Manager Sharon Warga. At that same meeting,

we thanked retiring trustees Peggy Conver, Mary Earick, Barbara Laverack, David Martin, and Susan McKimens for their service and honored Blue Heron School Director Laura Mammarelli with the Horizon Award.

Down at Lake Cruise Headquarters we added new interactive exhibits about Lake Turnover, Landscaping for Water Runoff Mitigation, and Solar Energy. Nine thousand six hundred people took a Lake Cruise, enjoyed the splendor of Squam Lake, and learned about its wildlife and history on our fleet of five boats.

The Board and staff started work on a new Strategic Plan. This will be our roadmap for the next five years. It’s always energizing to think ahead and imagine and plan for what the future holds, especially when you are in the midst of a hugely successful year.

So 2019 was a wonderful year in many ways. Little did we know what 2020 would bring . . . but that report is for next year!

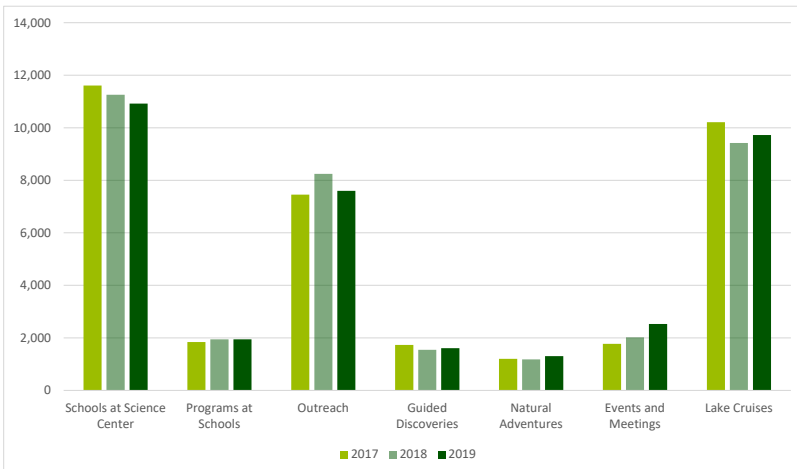

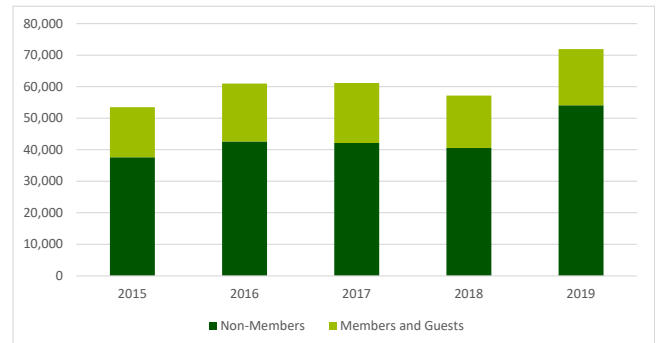

VOLUNTEERS

We often look to the past to reflect on the present. In 2019, we looked way back to prehistoric eras and welcomed animatronic dinosaurs as ambassadors from times long ago. Volunteers happily participated in sharing this special display with the thousands of guests who came to see Dinosaurs Alive! Greeters welcomed visitors, many dressed in their finest dinosaur garb, and docents dedicated time on the trail to give information about the dinosaurs and relate their lives to present-day species.

In 2019, a total of 194 regular volunteers and 109 one-time volunteers donated 7,942 hours of service. Americorps, Eversource, Hypertherm, J. Jill, Proctor Academy, Stonyfield, and the University of New Hampshire Cooperative Extension's Natural Resources Stewards, were among the corporate and school groups that volunteered for special projects. One hundred and ninety-four regular volunteers assisted staff and visitors, giving educational support and helping hands behind the scenes.

The annual Parsons Volunteer Recognition Dinner, named for long-standing volunteers Don and Natalie Parsons, was celebrated at the Common Man Inn and Spa in Plymouth. Board Chair Justin Van Etten announced the 2018 volunteer group highlighted for outstanding service: Field Camera Assistants. Naturalist Eric D'Aleo, who created the new position, spoke about the dedication they demonstrated as they regularly trekked into the back woods of Science Center property. Throughout the year, this group maintained the trail cameras used to capture wildlife images for the new exhibit, Hidden Stories. The volunteer team consisted of Charlie, Dawn, and Caitlyn Bourret, John and Elaine Egolf, Michelle Janosa, Barb Laverack, Lea A. Stewart, Tess Tremblay, and Betsy Whitmore.

The Volunteers Complete the Picture display, in the Trailhead Gallery shows the names of current volunteers who have donated at least 200 hours in total. Those added for 200 or more hours are Sylvia Detscher, John Egolf, Karen Grauly, George Gurney, Lex Hetrick, Linda Michelsen, Karen Rosolen, and Tess Tremblay. Volunteers who donated 500 or more hours are Joan Martin, Peggy Martin, Wayne Martin, and Ken Ruhm. Gary Robertson's name was added to the group who donated 1,000 or more hours.

Volunteers who donated 100 or more hours in 2018 were presented with the President's Volunteer Service Award pin and certificate. This award, initiated by the Corporation for National and Community Service, celebrates the impact volunteers make in bettering our communities and our world. PROGRAMS, PROJECTS, AND SPECIAL EVENTS

Highlights from 2019 You Made Possible

Whether during a family visit to the live animal exhibit trail, a weeklong summer camp for kids, a school field trip, a lake cruise, or an evening adult lecture, or one of many other adventures, more people than ever from all ages from all walks of life experienced and experienced discovery, engagement, and education at Squam Lakes Natural Science Center.

The Dinosaurs Alive! Exhibit was a popular draw for visitors from near and far. Five spectacular, gigantic, animatronic dinosaurs looked, moved, and sounded like the real thing, as displayed in natural settings along the live animal exhibit trail from July through September

Blue Heron School began its tenth year in its new location with 39 students, thanks to funding from the Education Matters Capital Campaign.



The Helen Clay Frick Foundation of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, gave funding to build a new kiosk in Kirkwood Gardens. Surplus funds were used for an upcoming interactive Solar Energy Exhibit. Frick Trustees Natalie Della Rosa and Ned Dane helped to acquire the funding.



The First Guides Teen Volunteer Program celebrated 10 years with over 100 teens ages 14 to 17 completing the program, some returning as docents. In 2019, the teen participants focused on community action projects such as trail maintenance and invasive species removal with Squam Lakes Association, a loon census with Loon Preservation Committee, bat counts for the NH Bat Colony Count, and invasive plants removal at the Science Center.

→ Science Pubs, held at local restaurant Walter's Basin, were popular with area adults. These off-season evening programs and community discussions were held in collaboration with Squam Lakes Association and Squam Lakes Conservation Society and will continue.



New exhibits were added to Lake Cruise Headquarters. They include one about lake turnover (the seasonal movement of water in a lake); a solar exhibit explaining the photovoltaic panels and battery system used to power lake cruise headquarters; information about plants and shrubs to use near water; and a large-scale map of Squam Lake showing the cruise route.



Members, staff, volunteers, and trustees, current and past, gathered in August to celebrate a major milestone: Senior Naturalist Dave Erler's 40 years on staff. Dave received the Legacy Award from the New Hampshire Environmental Educators and a commendation from Governor Chris Sununu for his dedication to nature ecology. He taught his last program on November 1 before his retirement. It's impossible to sum up Dave's influence on the Science Center or count the number of lives he shaped. His enthusiasm for teaching natural history never dimmed.



Pollinator Party in July was a great success with more than 800 people attending. The Caterpillar Lab showed their fascinating exhibits of live caterpillars and visitors learned about wildflowers, beekeeping, and more. Belknap Landscape Company sponsored the event.



Birthday Bash for the Critters in August showed enrichment activities to almost 900 visitors who learned how our animals are cared for physically and mentally through demonstrations throughout the day. The animals enjoyed birthday "cakes," presents to unwrap, and new enrichment items.

The record-breaking year for visitors this season meant just under 72,000 visitors enjoyed the live animal exhibit trail between May 1 and November 1. Over 9,600 passengers enjoyed guided Squam Lake Cruises; in total more than 107,000 people learned about environmental education from the Science Center.

This year we again summarized our financial information to show the impact of our Education Matters Capital Campaign in 2019 and 2018, as compared to regular operations. Financial results are unaudited, due to delays as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Operationally, (not including depreciation, investments, and capital campaign) 2019 resulted in a surplus of \$646 compared to a 2018 deficit of \$33,855.

Overall, our total net assets increased by \$1,310,313 primarily due to an increase in the value of our investments during 2019.
