- Founded:** 1966
- Size:** 232 acres of fields, forests, and wetlands
- Mission:** The mission of Squam Lakes Natural Science Center is to advance understanding of ecology by exploring New Hampshire's natural world.
- Staff:** 22 full time year-round; 11 part-time, 26 seasonal
- Volunteers:** 311 volunteers giving over 8,632 hours in 2018
- Program Attendance:** Over 25,000 guests served through school field trips, special events, and other programs at the Science Center
- Trail Attendance:** Over 57,000 guests in 2018
- Cruise Passengers:** More than 9,400 guests in 2018
